Sports Premium a Summary Report for 2014-2015

1 Context

From September 2013, the Government allocated funding directly to primary schools to support the provision of quality PE/Sport. Each school receives £8000 plus an extra £5 per pupil each year. Here at Bushey Heath Primary school we receive approximately £8900. This money is ring-fenced to ensure PE and sport is at the heart of school life to raise achievement for all young people.

2 Provision 2014 -2015

As a school we have identified three main areas we wanted to use the funding to enhance. These are:

- To increase participation in non-curriculum sports including competitive events especially for girls.
- To enable the children to take part in a wider range of sports and activities.
- To supply additional training for teachers to ensure outstanding PE teaching and learning.

Below is a table showing what we have already put in place to achieve these targets and also what we will continue to put in place in the future.

3 How will impact be measured

- Monitoring the number of pupils entering tournaments and the success of entrees.
- Monitoring the number of pupils accessing both free and paid clubs.
- Equipment is fit for purpose and used more effectively to deliver high quality lessons.
- Observation of children and staff during PE lessons using assessment criteria.
- Observation of specialist coaching staff and school staff leading after school clubs.
- Increase in pupil participation in PE/Sport.
- Fitness rates improved including children's awareness and understanding of healthy life styles measured through pupils' voice and fitness tests.

The purchase and reorganization of resources means that all is easily accessible.

After school clubs and bought in specialists have shown to provide high quality teaching and learning outcomes as good.
