There are numerous resources to support parents, carers, children, and young people with online safety; many of these have been signposted within <u>GOV.UK guidance</u> <u>Coronavirus (COVID-19): support for parents and carers to keep children safe online</u>. We are aware that extremists are exploiting COVID-19 to reinforce their pre-existing narrative and online platforms are hosting wider conspiratorial narratives, undermining efforts to deal with the crisis. All of which highlight the importance of digital literacy. Below we include a number of resources to support digital literacy and critical thinking.

Be Internet Citizens – lesson resources on fake news, hate speech, emotional manipulation.


BBC Evidence Toolkit – interactive software, lesson plans and teacher notes to review media stories.
